WEATHER

Trujillo has a dry climate with an average temperature of **21°C**. The summers can reach temperatures over **32°C** and the winters are never colder than **14°C**. The temperature stays in the low to mid twenties most of the year. Trujillo is known as "The City of Eternal Spring", because of its very sunny and pleasant weather year-round. The International Spring Festival in early October attracts visitors from all over Peru and from all over the world.

Wear light clothing (t-shirts and shorts), comfortable walking shoes, a hat and sunglasses. Nights tend to cool down, so bring along a light jacket or wear warm clothing. When traveling outside the city on any of the circuits, bring plenty of liquids.

HOW TO GET THERE?

The city is connected to all the main coastal cities by the Pan-American Highway. Important to the city's transportation network is the Cap. FAP Carlos Martínez de Pinillos International Airport. The towns of Salaverry and Chicama (Puerto Malabrigo) are used for maritime connection with the world.

PLACES TO VISIT

IN TRUJILLO

The Cathedral: Built in 1966, it houses precious works of art, in particular paintings from the Cusco School and a collection of religious sculptures.

Ganoza Chopitea House or House of the Lions: For many experts, this house is the most representative in the entire city of Trujillo. Its baroque.
